



Both parties rely upon previous awards of Boards on the property. The Carrier cites Award 2 of Public Law Board 564 and Award No. 2 of Public Law Board 1863; the Organization cites Award No. 214 of Special Board of Adjustment 361.

The Awards, though arising from varied factual situations, agree on the principle that conductors have always performed clerical work which is incidental to the performance of their regular duties, and that clerical work of that nature is not the exclusive work of any particular craft. Making reports on cars handled in their own train is given as an example in two of the awards of the kind of clerical work traditionally performed by conductors. The car check performed by the Claimant in this case fell within the general area of work incidental to the performance of his regular duties; he is therefore not entitled to the additional compensation he has claimed.

AWARD: Claim denied.
